


“Houseless” and looking to get into college?

Our mission is to create engaging and effective guidelines for homeless students to enter and succeed in higher education. “Homeless” is defined as having “individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.” From here on out we are going to refer to “homeless” as being “houseless.” Just because you are houseless, you can still succeed because of your challenges, not in spite of them.
