Day 1

Introduction to New Look Navigation

Users will receive an overview of the New Look, learn how to navigate, and how to search for modules using Tool Search.

PIV/2FA

Users will learn the importance of data security, how two-factor authentication helps protect student PII within the student information system, and how to approve and review 2FA/PIV requests.

NASIS Security Logistics

Users will learn how the 45-Day Login Update affects user accounts and how to utilize the NASIS Designation Form to ensure continued access for their school.

Sign In Logistics

Users will receive an overview on signing into NASIS using the different methods such as PIV or two-factor authentication.

New User Sessions

System Admin Part One

Users will be able to navigate items which were previously found in the system administration module such as generating reports, creating calendars, and updating district information.

System Admin Part Two

Continuation of Part One - Users will be able to navigate items which were previously found in the system administration module such as establishing tool rights and creating user accounts.

Census

Users will be able to add instructional and residential students and staff along with creating households.

Student Information

Users will be shown an overview of the student information module, student specific demographics, and using the student locator to enroll new students.

Attendance

Users will learn how to take attendance, monitor attendance, and run attendance reports.

Special Education

Users will learn how to assign team members, create documents, and log services for students receiving services as well as identify subcategory in System Administration for Special Education preferences and set up notifications for the Case Manager.

District Employment

Users will be able to add credentials to teachers, update staff FTE, and district assignments.

English Language Learners

Users will receive an overview of the EL module, location of data entry and how to place EL student status in NASIS.

Section 504

Users will receive an overview of the 504 module, location of data entry, how to access Section 504 Program fillable documents and how to place 504 student status in NASIS.

Course Set Up

Users will learn how to create courses and sections and will provide an overview of assigning teachers to the sections as well as adding grading tasks, grading calculations, and residential bed checks.

Scheduling

Users will gain an understanding of the different methods to schedule students, how to use the walk-in scheduler, add courses to a schedule, and applicable scheduling reports.

Grade Book

Users will be able to set up a gradebook, update grade calc options, and gain an understanding of the variety of tools within the gradebook to help teachers create and score assignments.

User Security
