- Ensure certified special education teachers are available to provide timely special education services.
- Ensure related service providers are available to provide related services.
- Ensure students with disabilities have current and active IEPs.
- Ensure all services being provided are documented.
- Ensure missed services are documented and provided.

If there are issues with any of these items, contact your Education Specialist (Special Education), Education Program Administrator, Associate Deputy Director or Principal so corrective action can take place.

From Director Dearman's Office

Director Dearman provided a Dear School Leader Letter on September 15, 2023, related to missed IEP services. Interactive Data Workshop (IDW)

DPA in partnership with other BIE offices and outside partners offered two in-person conferences over the summer. The 2023 IDW brought close to 500 staff from BIE-funded schools together to build the capacity of administrators and school-based staff to use data to inform improvement efforts to increase compliance and results for students with disabilities.

Circles of Reflection Toolkit

LRP

BIE-DPA provides free access to LRP publications for all BIE-funded schools. DirectSTEP is one resource available. It is an online course that merges legal and regulatory expertise with real-world application strategies. Course topics include but are not limited to autism; behavior management and discipline; co-teaching; instruction; paraprofessional training; and universal design. National Disability Employment Awareness Month

Each October, we celebrate National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM). NDEAM acknowledges the role of people with disabilities in the workforce nationally and is an opportunity to reflect on ensuring full access to employment and opportunities to thrive at work. This year also marks the 50th anniversary of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the first federal legislation to address access and equity for people with disabilities. Public Reporting

Each state is required to publicly report annually on the performance of each Local Education Agency (LEA); the BIE's LEAs are each BIE-funded school. The DPA-IDEA's data team leads this work that can be found at <u>https://www.bie.edu/topic-page/performancedata-statistics</u>. These data include performance for each BIE-funded school on required IDEA data collections within the State Performance Plan/Annual Performance Report (SPP/APR) that BIE submits to US Department of Education Office of Special Education Programs annually by February 1. BIE observes the suppression rules, meaning that BIE will not publicly report data on 10 or fewer students. Supporting Secondary Transition

Did you know BIE-DPA and partners at WestEd developed two asynchronous online courses for high school special education teachers and staff focused on secondary transition?

- Writing a High-Quality Transition Plan focuses on all aspects of developing a highquality secondary transition plan for students with disabilities. Learners will gain an understanding of the foundation of writing high-quality secondary transition plans and the reason why they are so important. The course will address conducting and gathering data from age-appropriate transition assessments; writing a present level of performance; developing measurable postsecondary goals; determining transition services and a course of study; and writing annual IEP goals.
- Centering Indigenous Students, Families, and Communities: Ways to Honor, Respect, and Relate concentrates on understanding the importance of recognizing and incorporating student culture when creating a high-quality secondary transition plan.
