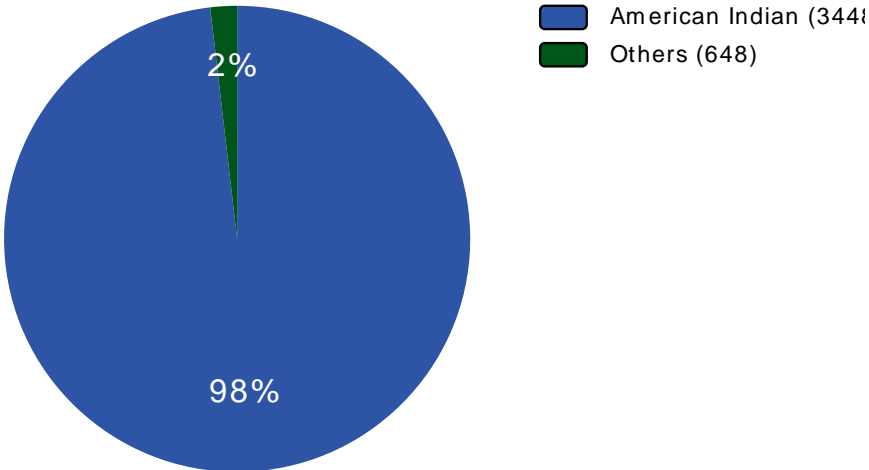

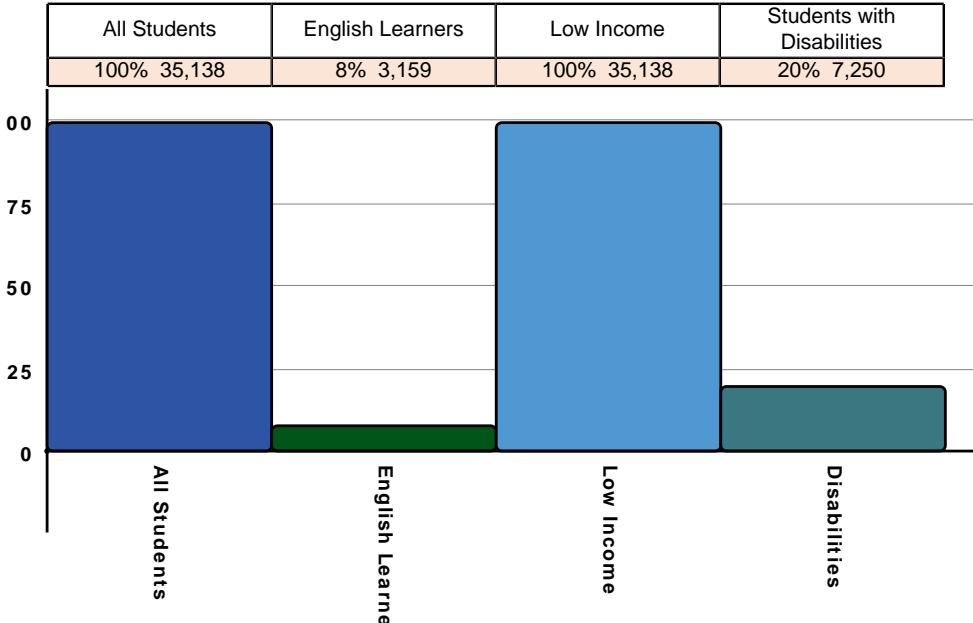

Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity




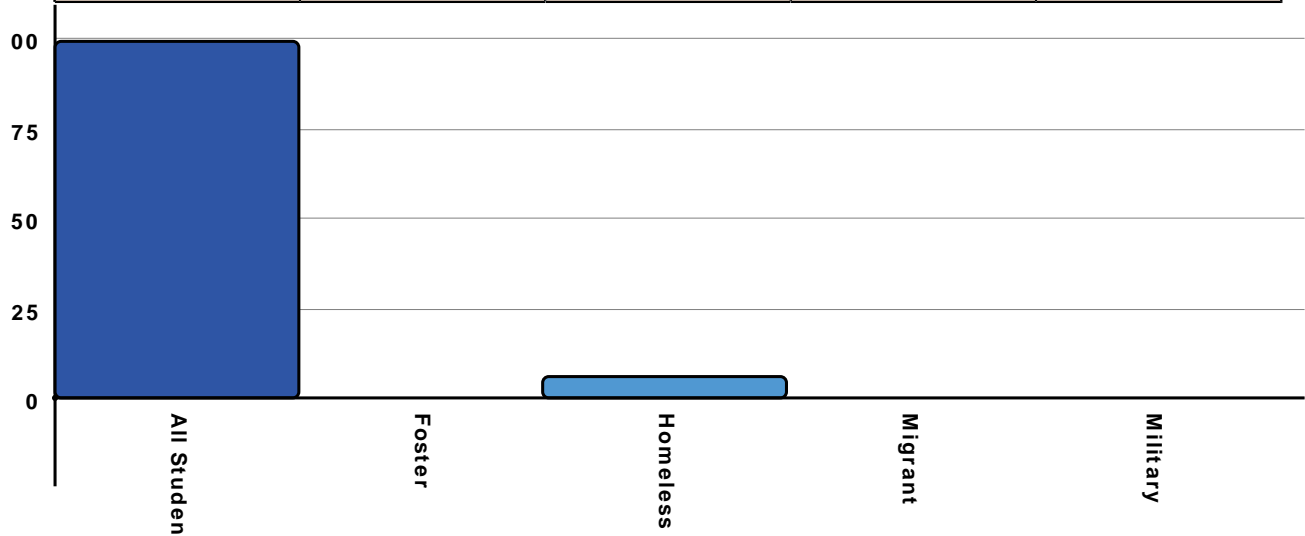

This count does not include students who enrolled after October 1st. It is also independent of the ISEP count which is the last Friday of October.

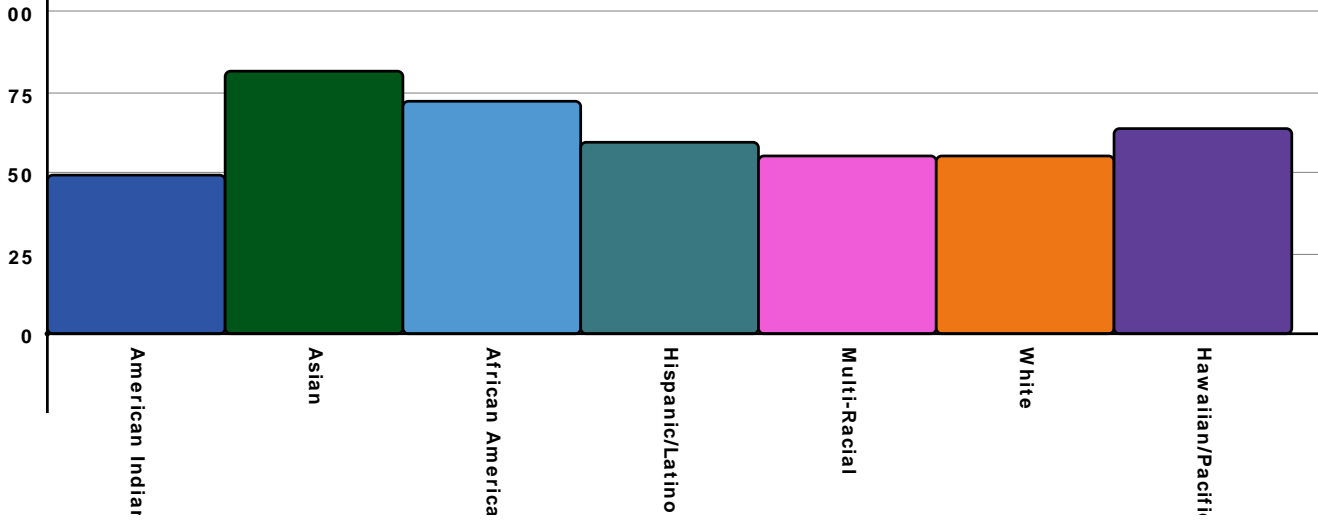

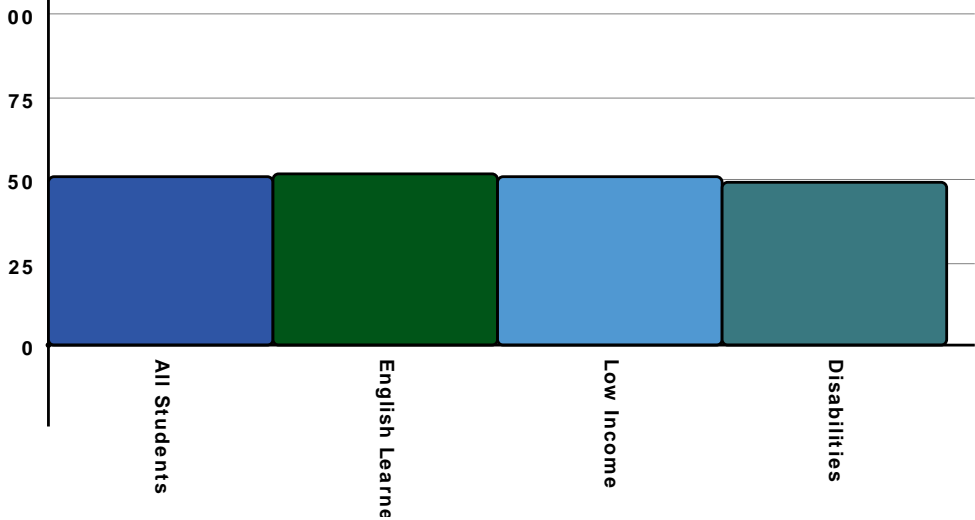

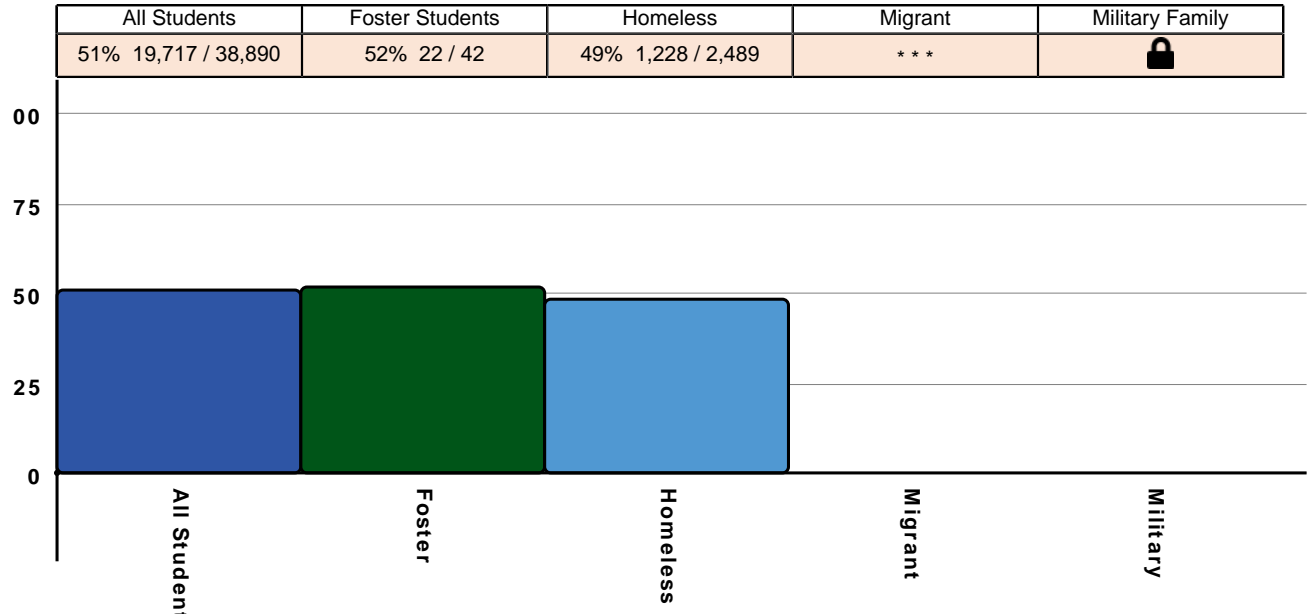
On Track Attendance by Other Characteristics

On-track attendance shares the percentage of students who are not chronically absent. Students must be present and ready to learn to succeed academically. Chronically absent students are those students who are absent for any reason (excused or unexcused), such as illness or out-of-school suspension, for 10% or more of a school's total school time between October 1 and May 31. School Year is represented by the last year of the school year. For example, the 2023-2024 school year is shown as 2024

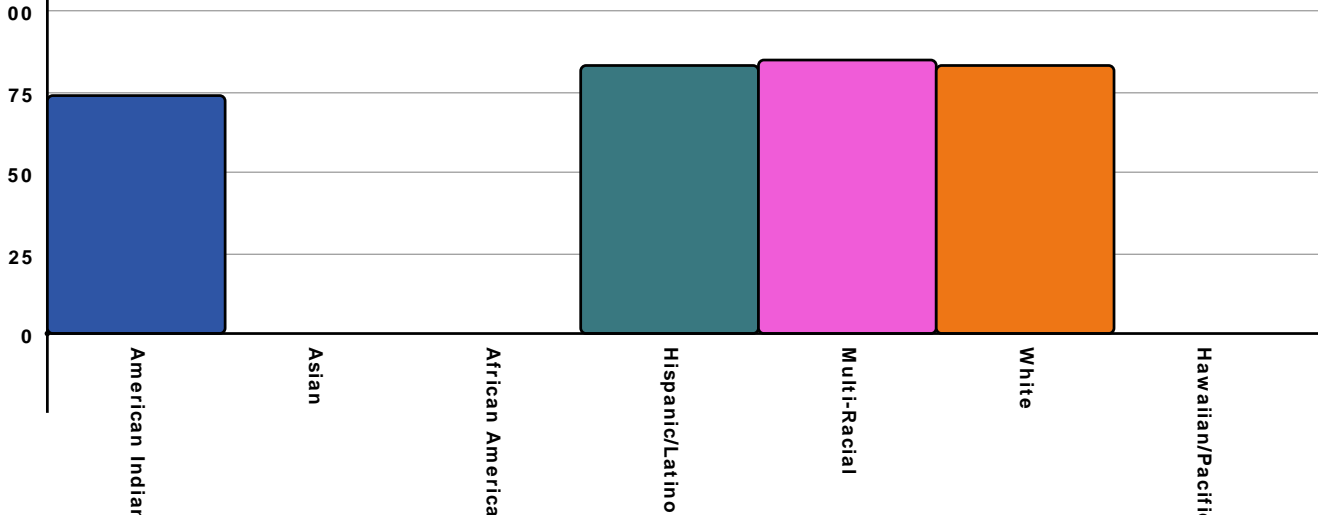

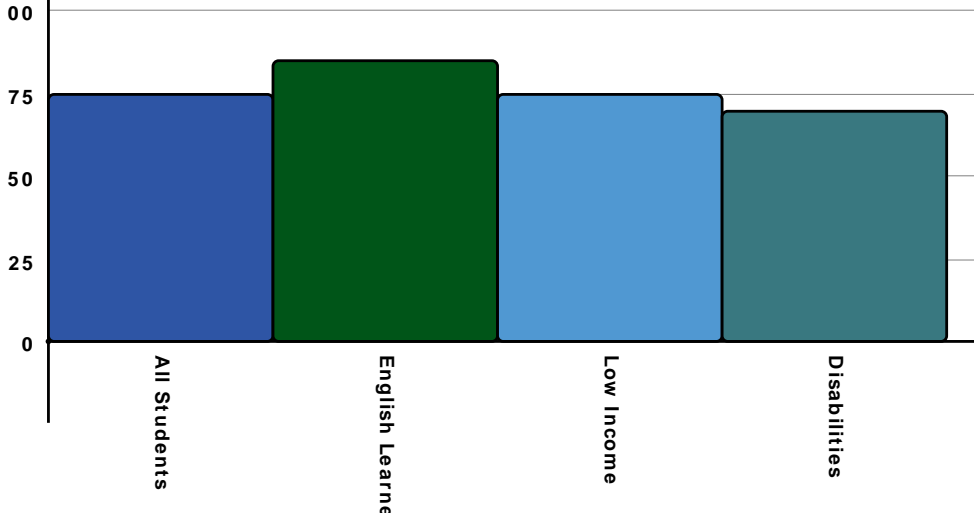

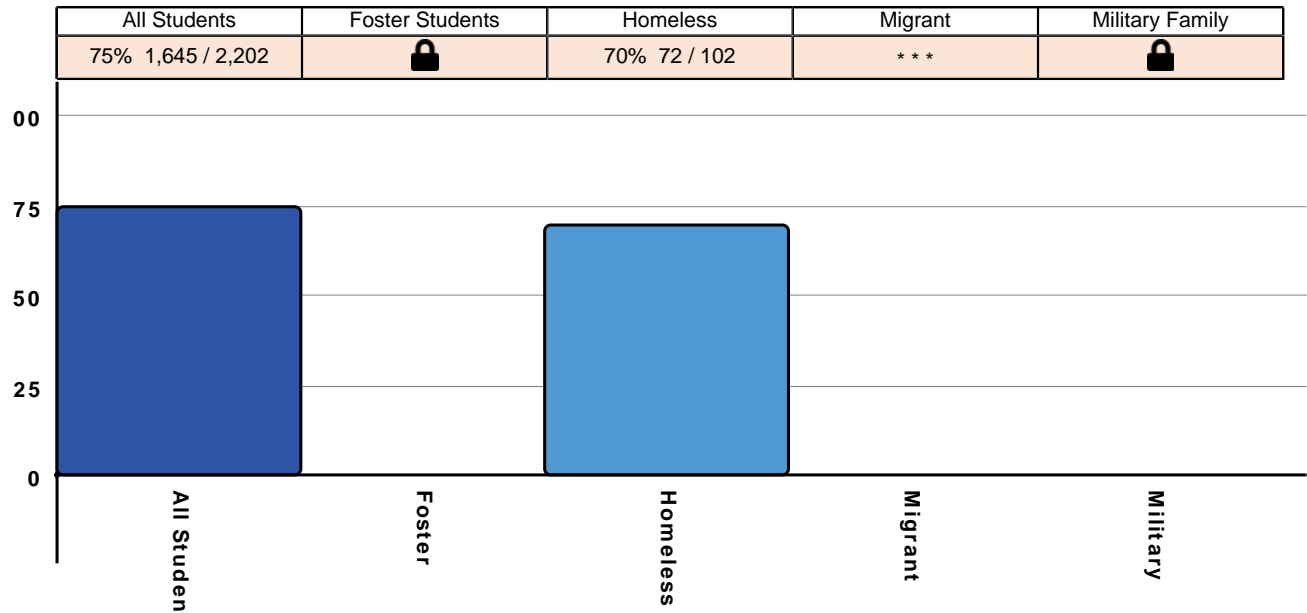

Graduation rates represent the percentage of students who graduated high school with a regular diploma. Graduation rates are calculated as prescribed by the US Department of Education, which provides data to the federal reporting system. In accordance with US Department of Education requirements, the Bureau of Indian Education uses the 4-year adjusted cohort graduation rate which is defined as the number of first-time 9th grades who graduate with a regular high school diploma in 4 years. Graduation rates do not include students who earn alternate diplomas or certificates of completion.

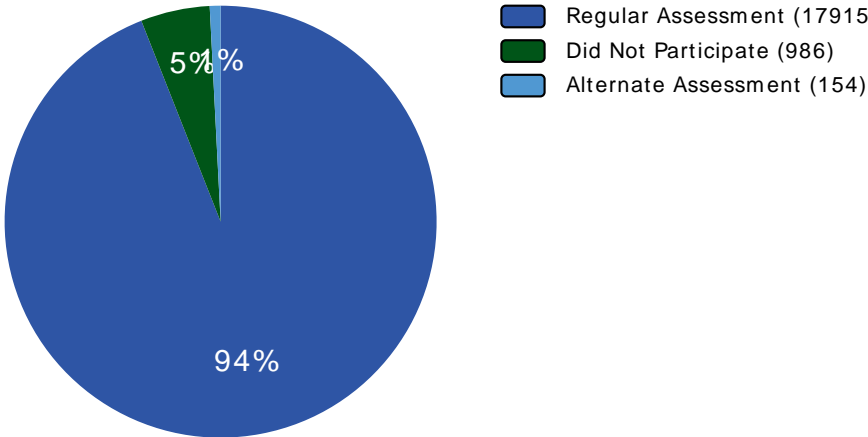

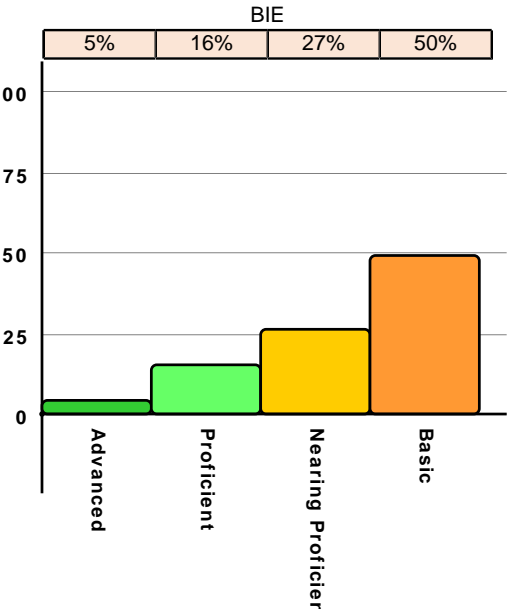

94.83% of students participated in the English Language Arts Assessment. The goal is 95% or higher.

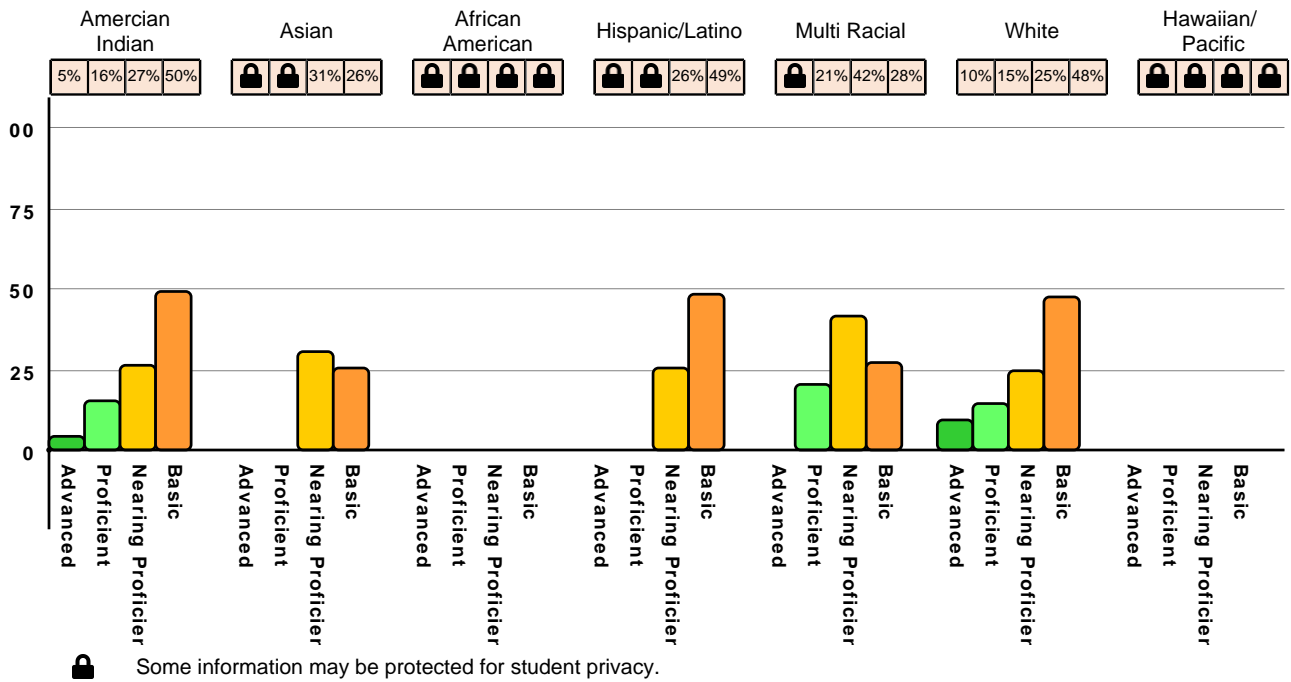
### English Language Arts Proficiency - All Students



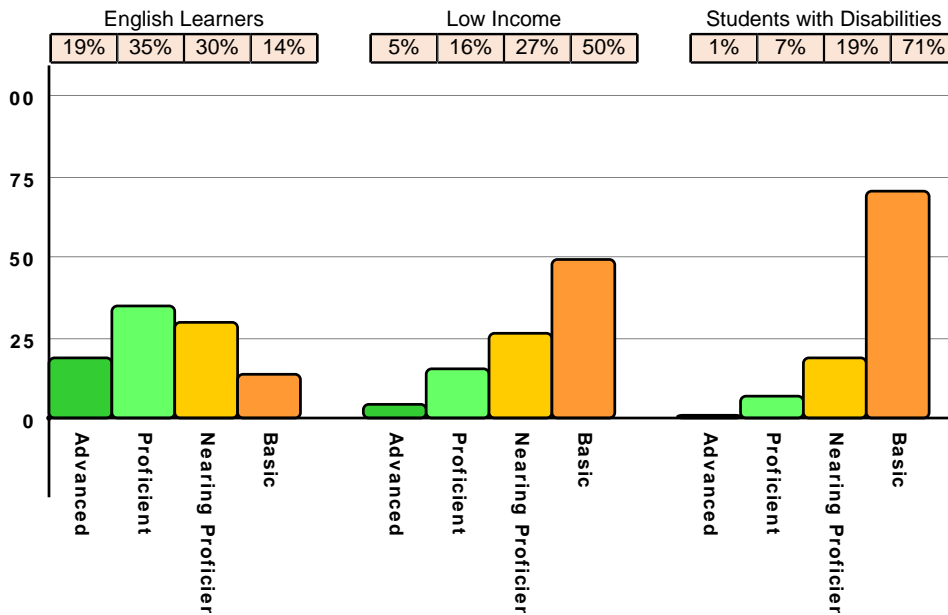

## English Language Arts Proficiencies by Race/Ethnicity

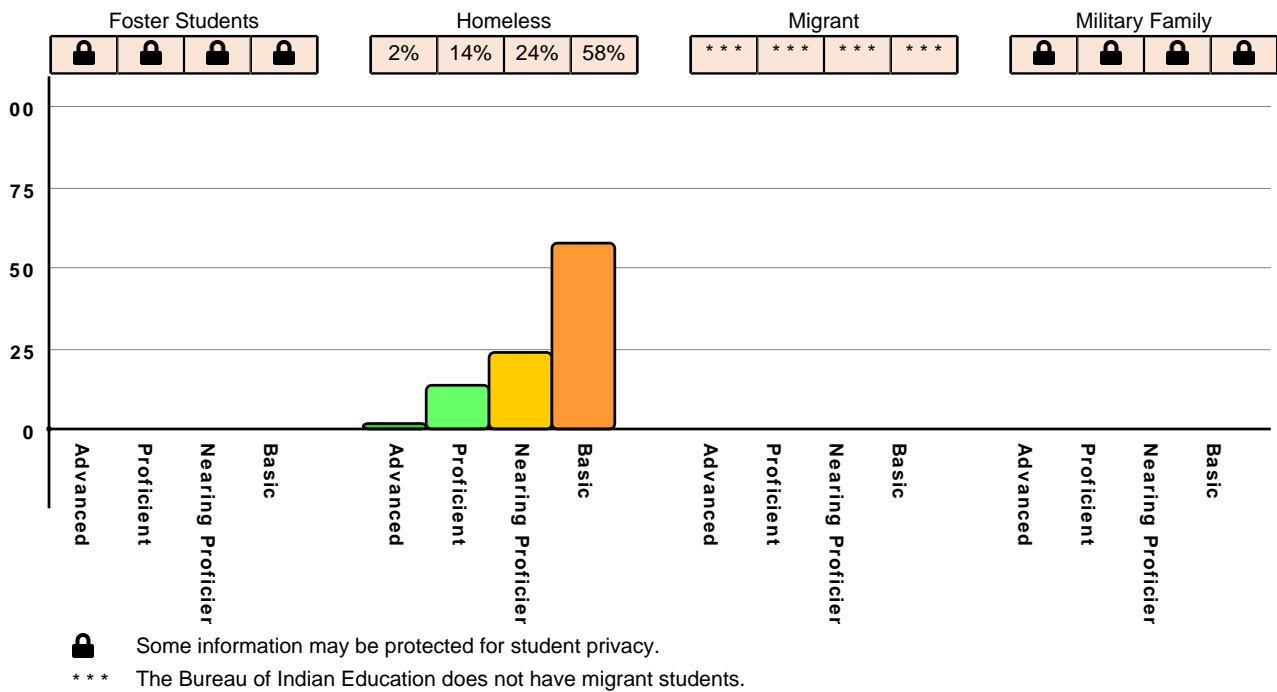

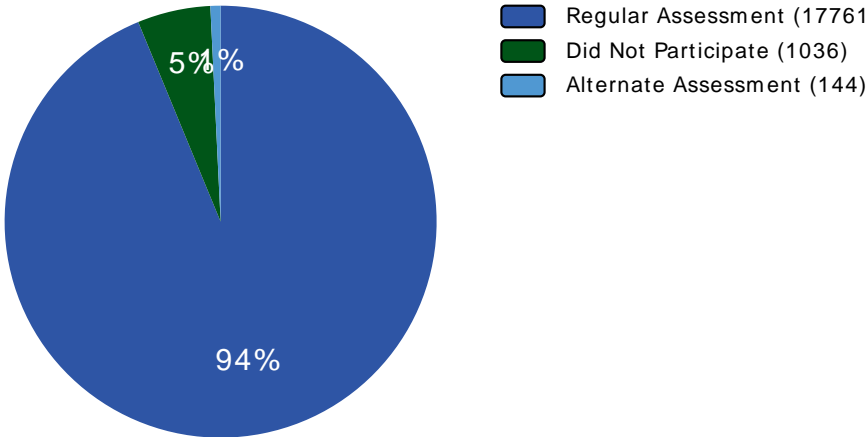

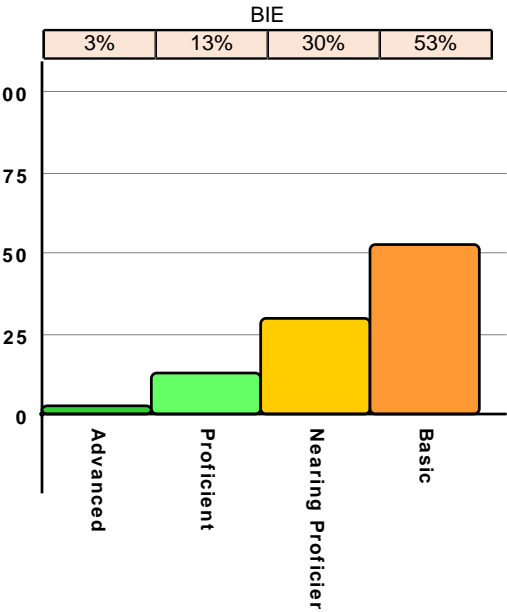

94.53% of students participated in the Mathematics Assessment. The goal is 95% or higher.

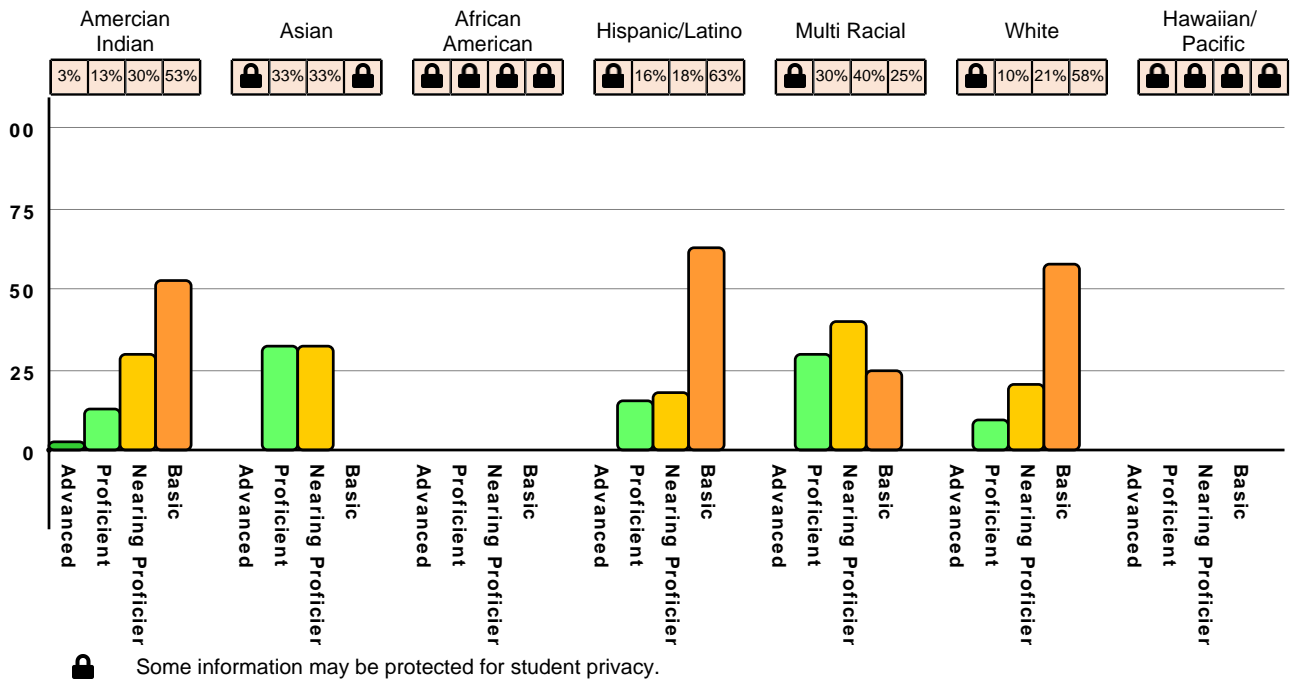
### Mathematics Proficiency - All Students



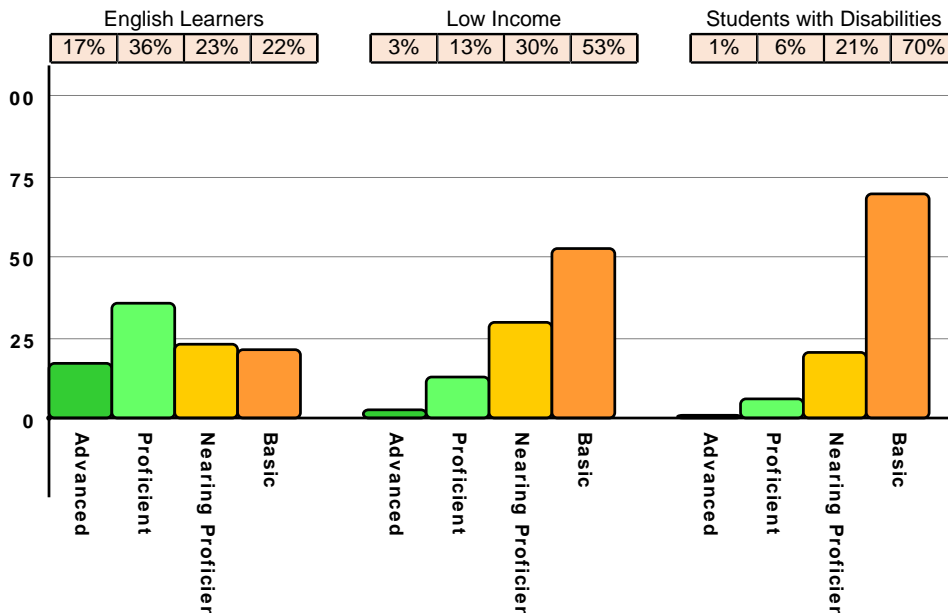

## Mathematics Proficiencies by Race/Ethnicity

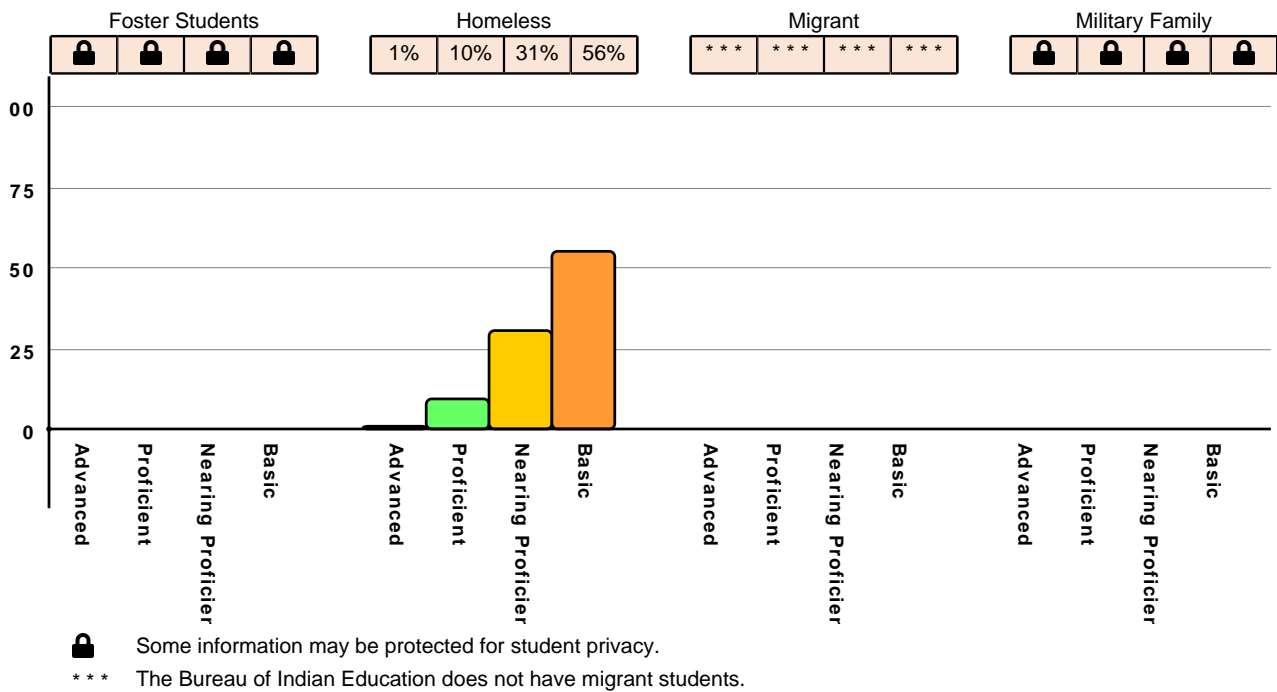


## Mathematics by Other Characteristics

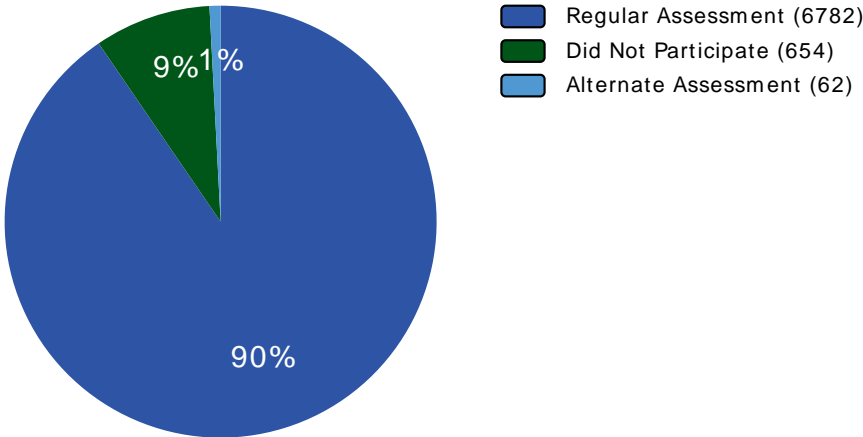

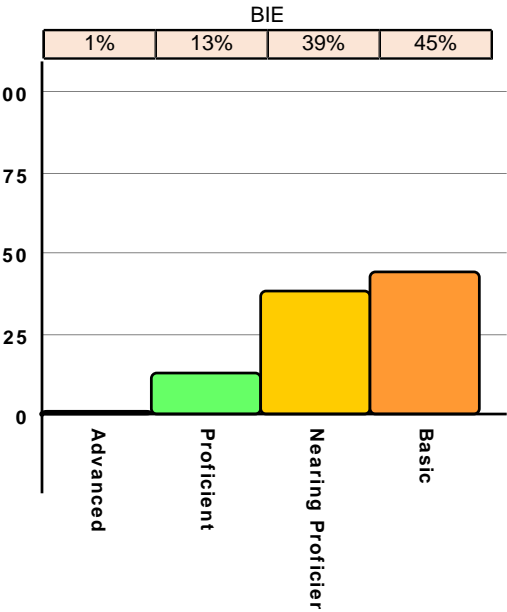

91.28% of students participated in the Science Assessment. The goal is 95% or higher.

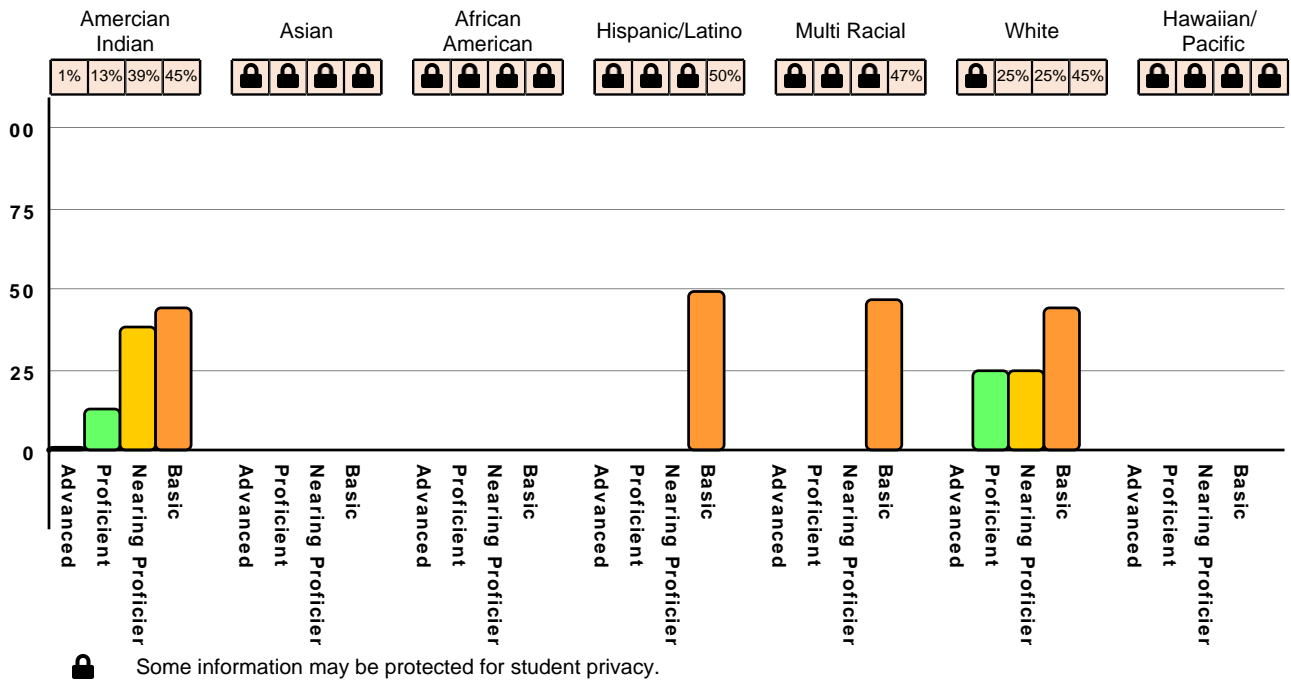
### Science Proficiency - All Students



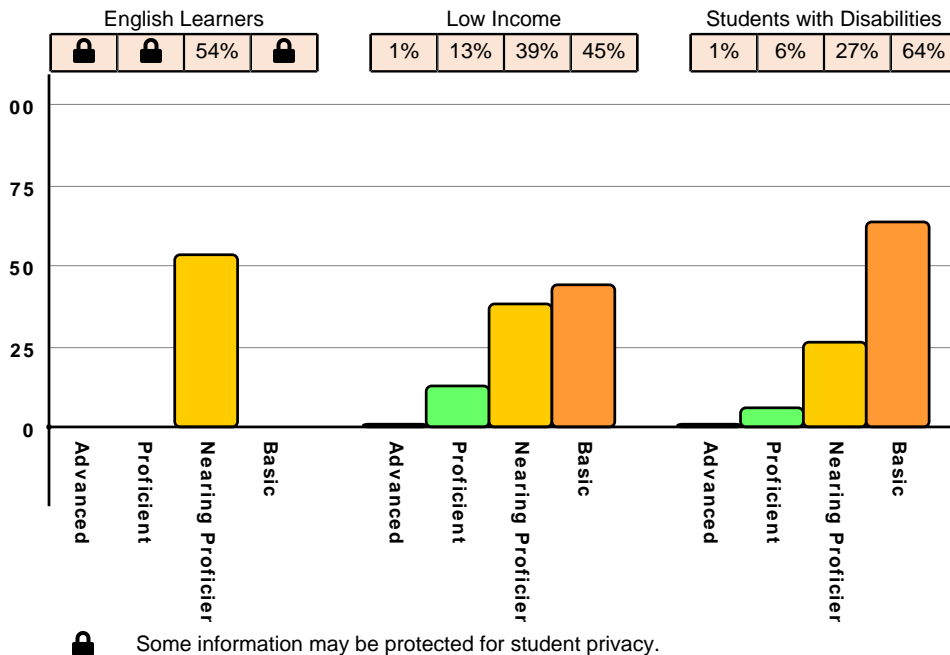

## Science Proficiencies by Race/Ethnicity

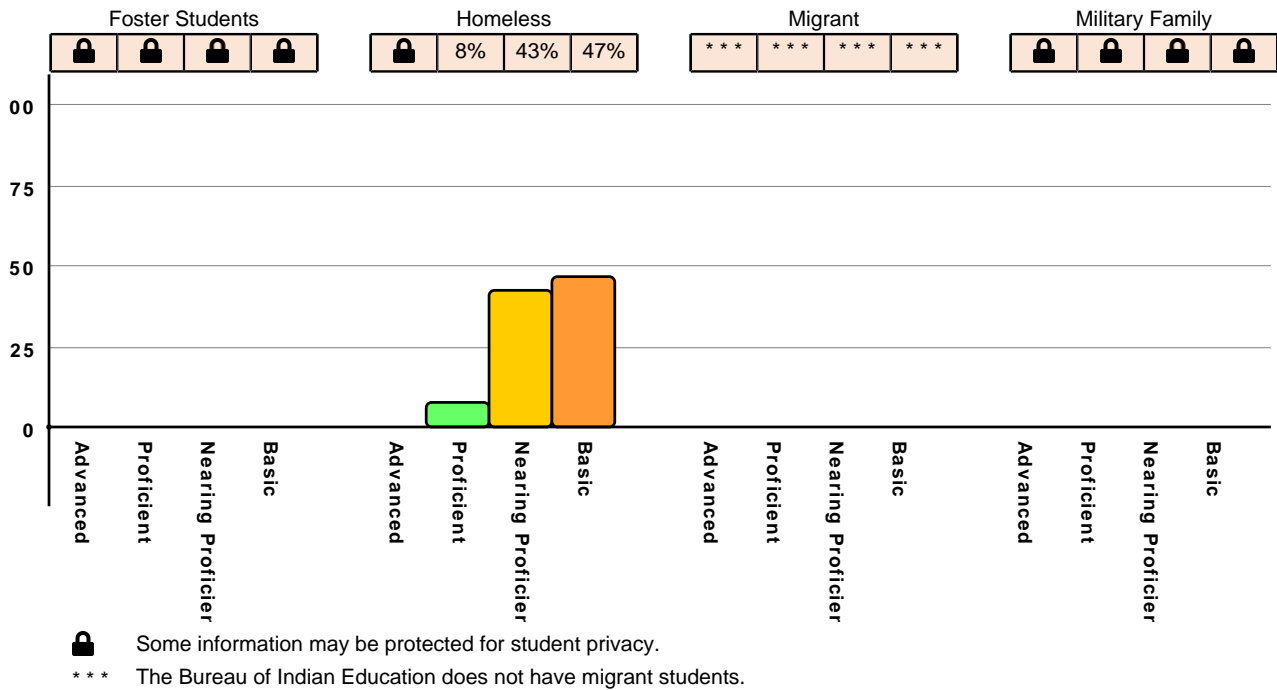

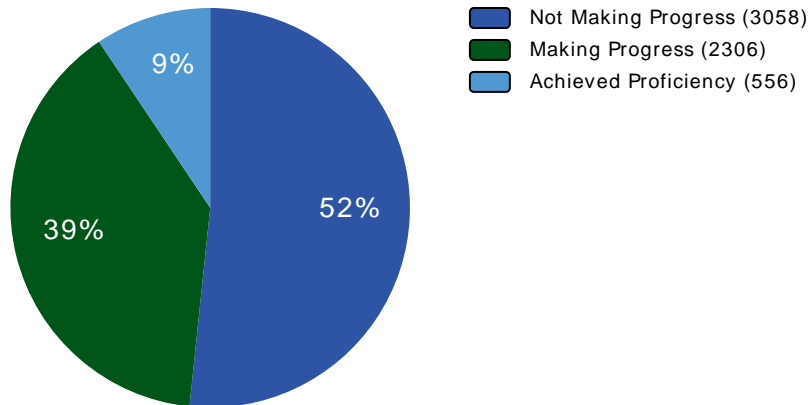
## English Learners

<b>Total Count:</b>	5888 out of 38261 students are English Learners. That is 15.39% of the student population.
<b>Making Progress:</b>	2306 out of 5888 students are making progress to become proficient. That is 39.16% of the English Learner students.
<b>Achieved Proficiency:</b>	556 out of 5888 students became proficient. That is 9.44% of the English Learner students.
<b>Not Making Progress:</b>	3058 out of 5888 students have not yet made progress to become proficient in English. That is 51.94% of the English Learner students.

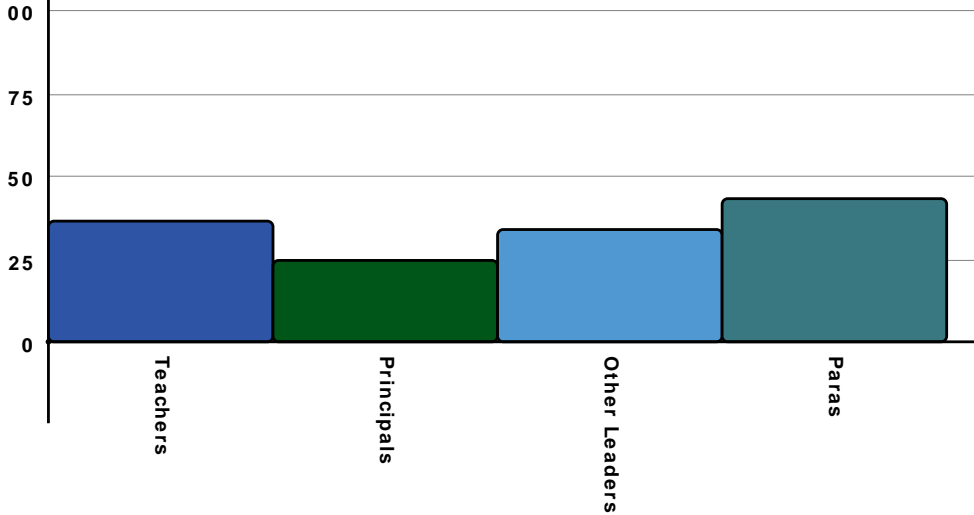

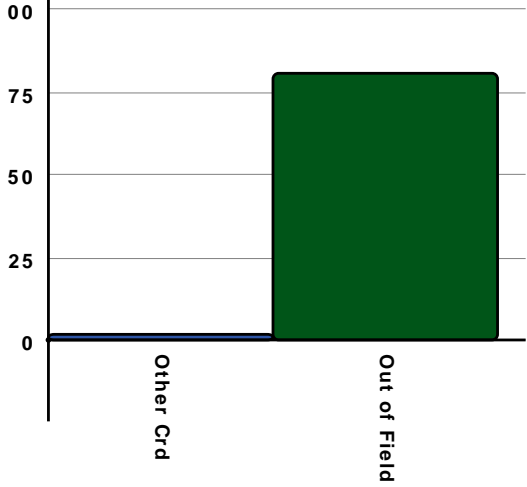

**Early Career Educators:** Educators with four or less years of experience.

An **Emergency Certificate** is issued to an educator who holds, or is eligible to hold, a teaching license but has not met the requirements for certification in a specific content area. An emergency certificate is issued only at the request of the hiring authority (e.g. school/LEA). Emergency certificates are generally valid for up to three years (or up to six years in the case of skilled and technical science teachers) unless revoked. Emergency certificates are not issued for all content areas.

**Out-of-field teachers** taught at least one course outside their licensed content area. While teachers holding an emergency certificate or certificate of eligibility are identified as teaching out-of-field in this analysis, these licensed educators are working towards full certification in the appropriate content areas.

**Other Credential Educators** hold a Temporary, Emergency, or Provisional License/Certification type AND they are teaching one or more courses as a primary or secondary teacher in the subject area of the credential.
