Dear Tribal Leader:

The Bureau of Indian Education (BIE) will hold two listening sessions on the Johnson-O'Malley Program (JOM) during the month of May. These sessions are designed to provide information and hear input from tribal leaders, tribal education staff, public school officials and other interested parties on the following issues related to the JOM program:

- Implementation of a distribution methodology based on the annual student count (as required by the JOM Modernization Act) Current target date for implementation is 2023-24 school year.
- Discussion of the JOM student count form.
- JOM Annual Report update.
- Clarification of JOM student eligibility criteria in 25 CFR 273.112.
- Discussion of allowable costs/expenditures of JOM funding in 25 CFR 273.113.
- Documents needed for annual award of funds (budget, student count form, etc.).
